Did You Know?

Your home value increases simply because we have a community pool!

"I don't use the pool or tennis court, so why would I join the HOA?"

This is a great question, and one that we get asked a lot. There are many reasons to join the HOA even if you have your own pool or don't go to the park!

I took a look at homes that sold between the dates of Jan 1, 2021 and June 30, 2022 and compared those that had community pools versus those that were in HOAs that didn't have community pools. Looking at the sales price compared with the asking price, homes in neighborhoods with HOA pools sold for on average 107% of list price, versus 105% for homes without a community pool. There is clear evidence that homebuyers seek out neighborhoods with these types of amenities, even if they

don't personally put those amenities to use! While 2% of your sales price may not seem like a lot, even a \$5,000 or \$10,000 increase in the value of your home can be very beneficial when you look to sell or refinance.

A small annual contribution that helps to maintain these community features brings every homeowner value and is a great investment in not only the neighborhood as a whole, but in each and every one of the homes in the neighborhood as well!

In 2023 we have a goal of 85% of the homeowners being a part of the HOA- help us meet that goal by joining today!

The Gardening Corner

PLANNING YOUR SPRING VEGETABLE GARDEN



Now is the time to begin planning your vegetable spring garden. Whether you are a beginner or an experienced gardener, some advanced planning can ensure you are ready when those spring planting dates roll around.

An excellent resource for Austin area vegetable gardeners is the Texas A&M Agrilife Extension Education

in Travis County website which can be found at https:// travis-tx.tamu.edu/about-2/horticulture/edible-gardensfor-austin/vegetable-gardening-in-austin/ Or on your browser search for Vegetable Gardening in Austin-Urban Programs Travis County. The site covers many vegetable gardening topics and provides guidance specifically for Austin and Travis County.

An important place to begin is the site's Vegetable Planting Calendar. The calendar provides a list of vegetables and the dates by which they should be planted. These dates consider the date of the last frost and the onset of hot weather so that gardeners have as long a growing season as possible.

Another indispensable resource on the website is the list of Vegetable Varieties for Central Texas. These varieties have performed successfully in this area. If you select other varieties, you may not get a good yield despite your best efforts. If you cannot find the seeds you want, the site also provides a list of sources for vegetable seeds.

The website's Easy Gardening Series, authored by Extension horticulturists, has fact sheets for individual vegetables. These sheets provide an in-depth look at the specific requirements for growing individual vegetables. The information includes but is not limited to soil preparation, varieties, planting, fertilizing, watering, care, insects, diseases, harvesting and storing. They may even include pictures of common insects and suggested control measures. The series also has fact sheets on topics of general interest to gardeners such as soil preparation, composting and fertilizing.



Recipe Connen

New England Cranberry Duff

Ingredients

1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, softened 1 ½ cups fresh or frozen cranberries 1/3 cup chopped pecans, toasted

1/3 cup + ½ cup sugar 1 large egg ½ cup all-purpose flour ¼ tsp. salt



Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 325. Butter bottom and sides of an 8x8 glass baking dish with 2 Tbsp. butter. Spread cranberries over bottom of dish. Sprinkle pecans on top, then sprinkle with 1/3 cup of sugar.
- 2. Melt remaining 6 Tbsp. butter and set aside. Whisk egg and remaining ½ cup sugar until pale and thick. Gradually beat in flour, then salt. Pour in melted butter and beat until smooth.
- 3. Pour batter over cranberries and pecans. Bake 45 minutes or until golden brown. Let cool on wire rack for 10 minutes. Invert onto a serving platter or just serve right out of the pan! Enjoy!
