Bouncing Back - The Resilience of Granada Hills

The Ice Storm of 2023 left behind tremendous damage to our neighborhood – primarily our beloved trees. The storm arrived January 31st and hung around for about four days, resulting in massive power outages, as well as $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{3}{4}$ inches of ice accumulation. This tremendous weight was just too much for many of the trees. For multiple days, we helplessly listened to the ear-splitting cracks of branches splitting and the booms of them falling. We cautiously emerged to find what looked like a war zone. Our streets and yards were littered with branches, debris, and sometimes entire downed trees. People were without power, and crews were working around the clock to provide support to those in need.

Throughout Granada Hills, not unlike the rest of the city, we are working to clean up storm debris, downed trees and branches, and repair damages to homes. The hum of chainsaws now fills the air and has become a new normal for the time being. As with so many disasters, the silver lining lies in the kindness and generosity that overflows in times of need. Neighbors are outside, spending long hours talking with and helping one another. We are knocking on the doors of our neighbors, bringing them food, sharing

- 10. Prune bushes and shrubs
- 11. Trim low-lying tree limbs
- 12. Plant new flowers as needed



Granada Ridge Apartments

Development Update By Anna Coots

Development of the long-awaited, 40-acres property backing up to Candelaria and Cima Circle is well underway. Land prep for the future 3-building x 5-story, 372unit "Granada Ridge Apartments" began in late 2022 with the clearing of trees. Many residents experienced falling ash heavy smoke inhalation from this phase that we are thankful is now complete. The tree buffer that exists now will remain part of a total of about 75% pervious/25% impervious coverage, according to the project plan.



The intense pounding, beeping, and earth-moving vibrations we have been experiencing is the digging of 2 very large filtration ponds located just inside the tree buffer line. Pond 1 backs up to properties on Cima Circle and Pond 2 backs up to properties on Candelaria Drive. According to the developer, this land-clearing and heavy prep phase should be completed by the end of February. Though Travis county does not restrict the morning start time, the developer and general contractor have agreed upon a 7am start time - a welcome improvement from the initial 5:30am start. Saturdays are usually work days and Sundays are usually quiet.

The main entrance of the apartment complex will be on Scenic Brook, which will be extending south of highway 290 with the new access road. There will be a second "emergency" exit through the Ridge View neighborhood along Carlina Ridge. There is no plan to connect roads between the Granada Hills neighborhood and Granada Ridge apartments.

Combine all ingredients. Pour into a loaf pan (greased and flowered). Bake at 350° for 45 to 50 minutes. Enjoy!





Granada Hills Pool - Summer 2023

Texas is known for it's drastic shifts in weather, and takes no time going from an ice storm to scorching hot, so it's already time to start thinking about how to stay cool and keep the kids busy this summer. Remember how hot it was last summer!!!

Here's your answer ... right here in our own neighborhood is the fabulous Granada Hills pool that will open the beginning of May for the season. The pool is a great place to cool off, enjoy some family time and a great place to meet neighbors. And if you're a little older like me, here's my secret ... the pool is a great place to swim laps the last hour of the day when we usually have the whole pool to ourselves!

Pool memberships are available to HOA members again this year for \$315 for a family membership and \$275 for seniors (if you are a new pool member there is a one-time fee of \$50 to get you set up). If you have friends outside of Granada Hills who would like to join, we also have non-resident memberships available.

The pool is also a great place to host a birthday party. The pool picnic area is available for 3-hour private party rentals to pool members and non-members. There is a maximum limit of 30 guests.

Swimming is at your own risk and lifeguards are not present or provided. Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult (at least 18 years of age). Supervision of children at all times is the responsibility of the parent or adult guardian.
