## Regarding property taxes:

Just as I'm sure many of you struggled with protesting your property taxes this year, we as a board came across the same roadblock. The tax assessor quadrupled the value of the Granada Hills community property, and even after protesting live to the board, they declined to reduce our tax assessment back down to last year's value.

Something that you may not know is that the park and pool grounds are owned by the HOA- so we have to pay property taxes on those. This is another great reason to contribute to the association... not only does maintaining them for our public use cost quite a lot of money for tree trimming, landscaping, painting, mulch, electricity etc., but we also have to pay taxes on the land. We know that the park is free to use by all in the neighborhood and we plan to keep it that way, but if you or anyone in your household have ever enjoyed an afternoon at the park, or simply enjoy the view when passing by, please consider donating to the association for taxes and upkeep.

We'll try again next year and hopefully have a more reasonable tax board considering our situation.

## Gardening Tips from the Yaupon Garden Club of Austin WINTER GARDENING TASKS

**Wildflowers:** It's time to plant wildflowers! Give seeds good contact with soil and when they germinate, water enough to help them establish before the real cold hits.

**Grass:** If you like the ever-green lawn, then Perennial Rye may be for you. It's inexpensive and quite care-free, germinates without any help and easily greens up the landscape - without invading your flower beds! Thanks to the El Niño weather pattern, you may water Perennial Rye a little just to get it started. Its naturally low profile doesn't need much mowing, it will survive cold with no trouble, and its root system loosens the soil. Perennial Rye is a cool season grass and will die off when Spring arrives. Be sure to choose PERENNIAL

Rye, NOT ANNUAL Rye (Elbon) which is coarse, tall, and more appropriate for cropland.

**Mulch:** Consider a plan using contrasting textures of mulch laid down in large-scale patterns that complement existing plants. Mulch can still do its job of protecting



but as an interesting design. Try these:

- Coarse shards of chipped-up trees (good for paths)
- Finely shredded hardwood mulch
- Chips of Pine Bark mulch
- Beautiful fine-textured Pine Needles.

The over-all idea is to shrink the amount of thirsty grass while creating other attractive surfaces. Rock and stone can play a role too, but as rock retains heat, emphasize rocky designs a bit farther from your house.

**Pruning:** Best done in the coldest part of winter (December and January) when the plants are dormant. This general rule applies to most plants, BUT roses and summer flowering shrubs should be pruned in LATE winter before spring growth begins. The Complete Guide to Texas Gardening (Sperry, 1991) says that for each type of plant there are "Best Times to Prune" and "Acceptable Times to Prune" and "Seasons to Avoid Pruning"

## **Butterscotch Haystacks**

#### Ingredients

- 1 cup peanuts
- 1 10 oz bag of Chow Mein noodles
- 1 package butterscotch chips

#### Directions

Place the butterscotch chips in a the top pan of a double boiler. Heat the water underneath and slowly stir the chips until melted. Remove from heat and add in the peanuts and Chow Mein noodles. Mix just until combined. Place spoonfuls of mixture onto a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let harden. Serve to your favorite people with a glass of milk!

As a reminder, your dues pay for....


- PEC Electric Bill for security lights around the park so neighbors feel safer and can play basketball and tennis in the evenings

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
